2016

UN General Assembly HLM on AMR

OIE and FAO governing bodies endorsed Global Action Plan

2017

Interagency Coordination Group (IACG) on AMR was established

2018

WHO, FAO and OIE sign an MoU to strengthen their long-standing partnership, with a strong focus on AMR in a One Health context

2019

- IACG launched its report with recommendations
- Quadripartite Joint Secretariat (QJS) established and hosted by WHO
- 2nd Ministerial Conference on AMR

AMR-GLG established

April 29, high-level dialogue on AMR and the call to action

- UNEP joins FAO, WHO and WOA to form the Quadripartite

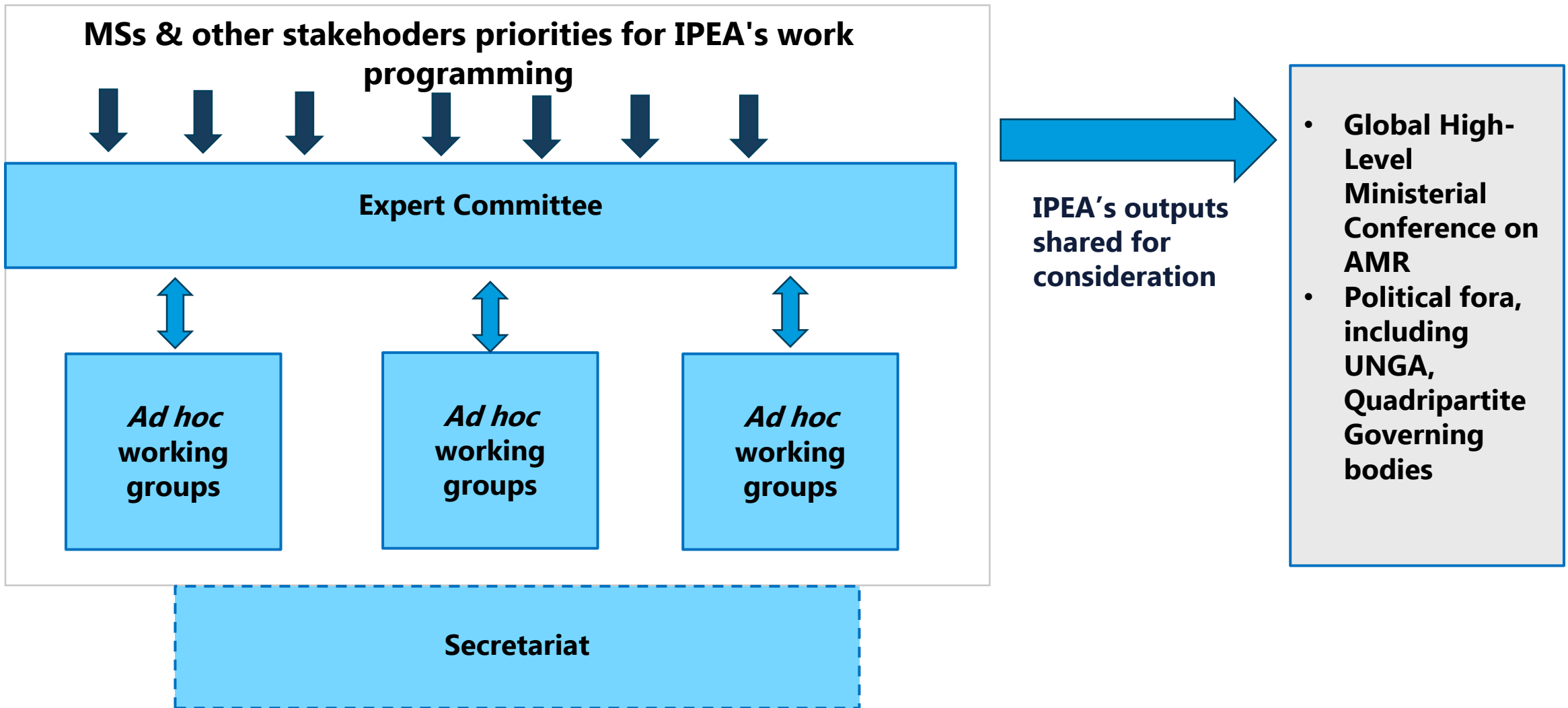

Updating the Global Action Plan on AMR

Scheduled for adoption by WHA 2026, and subsequently by WOA, FAO and UNEP

GAP 2015

- 1 **Improve awareness and understanding** of antimicrobial resistance through effective communication, education and training
- 2 Strengthen the **knowledge and evidence base** through **surveillance and research**
- 3 **Reduce the incidence of infection** through effective sanitation, hygiene and infection prevention measures.
- 4 **Optimize the use of antimicrobial medicines** in human and animal health
- 5 Develop the **economic case for sustainable investment** that takes account of the needs of all countries, and **increase investment in new medicines, diagnostic tools, vaccines** and other interventions.



Updated GAP

- 1 Strengthen awareness and **promote appropriate social and behavioural change to reduce AMR risks across all sectors**
- 2 Strengthen **surveillance systems and laboratory networks** to inform effective, **evidence-driven AMR policies and actions across all sectors**
- 3 **Intensify infection prevention across all sectors** to reduce the **burden of infectious diseases and the need for antimicrobials**
- 4 Ensure **equitable access, appropriate use and safe disposal** of antimicrobials, diagnostics and other health products across sectors
- 5 **Accelerate AMR research and innovation across all sectors**
- 6 **Strengthen multisectoral governance, sustainable financing and accountability for a coordinated AMR responses** across all sectors and at all levels
